1977 CO-ORDINATED OFFSHORE RACING PROGRAMME

1 PROGRAMME

The dates have been carefully chosen in order that owners wishing to compete seriously in the Southern Section of the ISORA programme and, particularly from both Clubs point of view, in the Victoria Cup, may do so without prejudicing their chance for the Tom Smith Memorial Trophy. There are now four races in the programme, either starting at Pwllheli and finishing at Abersoch or vice versa which, it is hoped, will help to encourage participation.

2 LEVEL RACING

The Penmaen Trophy is to encourage level racing at half ton 21.7 IOR within the existing programme. This will be open to members of both Clubs owning yachts rated between 18.1 and 21.7 inclusive. There will be a series of five races with four to count and the two long races to have a points loading of x 1.25. These will be:

- 1 Sara Bach Trophy
- 2 Cowper Cup
- 3 James Eadie Cup (x1.25)
- 4 St George's Channel (x1.25)
- 5 Pen Duick Cup

The system of calculating points is as displayed on Class 2 Notice Board, after eliminating the position of those boats from other clubs and also those not within the above rating.

3 DESCO CUP

On the day following the Newquay Regatta, the PSC Desco Cup will be raced on the following course: Newquay, Causeway(S), PSC ODM(S)

4 ST GEORGE'S CHANNEL RACE

This is again designated a long race to give an alternative to the RORC and Tod Trophy for those competing in the Southern Section of ISORA which required a minimum of one long race in the four counting to the points championship. All long races will have a guaranteed minimum of ten starters for the purpose of calculating points by ISORA.

5 DISTINGUISHING FLAGS

Attention is drawn to the following distinguishing flags to be flown on the backstay, together with division of classes applicable to the James Eadie, George's Channel and all other ISORA races.

- Division A1 Rating 24.6 - 70.0 Numeral 1
- Division A2 Rating 21.8 - 24.5 Numeral 2
- Division B Rating 16.0 - 21.7 Numeral 3
- Division C as previously described Numeral 4

6 TOM SMITH MEMORIAL TROPHY

This trophy, kindly presented by Betty Smith, is to encourage offshore racing and is awarded to the yacht achieving the highest total of points from all the co-ordinated races appearing in this programme. The system of calculating will be displayed on the Class 2 Notice Board after eliminating the position of those boats from Clubs other than SCYC and PSC.

7 ISORA VICTORIA CUP

The attention of owners is called to the ISORA Victoria Cup competed for by nominated club teams of three boats in each race.

8 RETIREMENT OR FAILURE TO START

All owners are reminded that it is absolutely essential that they inform a responsible official at the earliest opportunity in the event of retiring from or not starting a previously entered race. Considerable expenditure of public money can otherwise result with consequent official enquiry and the embarrassment that this will cause to all concerned.

9 HIGH WATER

There is so little difference between Abersoch and Pwllheli these HW times are average for both Clubs.

10 STARTING LINE SCYC

In view of the great difficulties encountered when starting and finishing through the mooring, the start and finish line has been moved to outside the moorings. Owners are advised to study these alterations in the general Race Instructions.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1 The race instructions printed in this booklet should be taken as the official instructions for all races within the co-ordinated programme
EXCLUDING The James C Eadie Cup Race
The St George's Channel Race
Special instructions will be issued to competitors upon application to ISORA.
- 2 Entry fees for all races, unless otherwise stated, are £1.50 per entry.
- 3 Co-ordinated races are now included on Block Entry Forms available from each sponsoring club. Excluding the races specified above, boats which have been entered for the races of their own club may take part in any race of the other club without the necessity of submitting a further official entry form to the club concerned. This facility only extends to a member who, having entered his yacht, has supplied the yacht's description and rating (if applicable) to his own club at the beginning of the season. Yacht owners who are members of neither club must submit an entry and receive acceptance in good time prior to the race.
- 4 Handicaps will be worked on TMF
- 5 All races detailed in the programme are Open.
- 6 During the course of the season, owners may be called upon to satisfy the Safety Officers that their boats comply in all respects with the specified regulations.
- 7 AWARDS:
Prizes will be given to at least the first boat providing that there are at least two entries.
- 8 In the event of races being run to Eire, the Club will notify HM Customs of the entries. Upon arrival in Ireland, owners must ensure that formalities are complied with. Similarly, on return, the responsibility lies with the owner, who must ensure that HM Customs are notified as soon as possible.

- 9 If coastguards have been informed of a boat's intended passage, they must be immediately advised when she makes harbour or alternatively, decides to postpone or cancel the passage.

RACE INSTRUCTIONS - GENERAL

1 STARTING AND FINISHING LINES SCYC

Starting Line:

The Starting Line is formed by a continuation SEAWARDS of a STRAIGHT Line joining the GREEN and ORANGE based Flag Staff in front of the SCYC Clubhouse and the BLACK SPHERICAL BUOY surmounted by a BLACK POLE positioned to SEAWARD of the moorings. The INNER Limit of the Starting Line (IDMB) is marked by the same BLACK SPHERICAL BUOY. The OUTER Limit of the Starting Line (ODMB) is marked by a BLACK SPHERICAL BUOY with CIRCULAR BLACK TOP MARK. The Starting Line will be entirely to SEAWARD of the mooring area and yachts should start between the INNER and OUTER Limit marks described above. The OUTER Limit mark may or may not be situated exactly on the line.

NB: For James Eadie and St George's Channel Races see Revised Instructions in ISORA Programme.

Finishing Line:

The Finishing Line is formed by a straight line joining the circular sight in front of the Clubhouse and the ODMB. Yachts must pass between ODMB and IDMB when finishing.

SCYC Finishing Line bears 295 degrees magnetic from seaward.

PSC

Starting Line:

The Starting Line is a transit passing through the large Club flag pole and a post with a red triangular top mark situated on the seaward side. The line is bounded by the Outer Distance Mark (ODM) inside which yachts must pass when crossing the line at the start and finish.

NB: When starting a race, the OOD will site along the side of the poles on which the competitors are starting,

Finishing Line:

The finishing line is a line between the vertical wire on the circular sight mounted on the rail of the starters balcony and the Outer Distance Mark (ODM).

2 SIGNALS

The Class flag for Group A will be IC Pennant 3
The Class flag for Group B will be IC Pennant 5
Class flags will be raised on the ten minute gun. Starting signals as per IYRU rules.

2 SIGNALS (contd)

PSC and SCYC RECALLS - if a yacht is over the starting line when the signal to start is made a gun will be fired or a suitable signal made and numeral pennant "O" (yellow and red) will be broken out. Any yacht over the starting line too soon must return to cross the line in accordance with IYRU rule 8. See RORC Special Regulations 7.

GENERAL RECALL - the first substitute flag broken out, together with the firing of two guns.

CANCELLATION SIGNAL - Flag N will be hoisted over the first substitute and three guns fired; when the above flags are displayed alone this means that all races are cancelled; when the above flags are flown over the class signal the designated race is cancelled.

ABANDONMENT - (after the starting signal), flag N will be hoisted and three guns fired. The race can be sailed at a later date if desired.

POSTPONEMENT - The IC Answering pennant (red and white vertical stripes) will be flown as follows:

- (i) When displayed over one ball or shape and a class signal means "The scheduled time of the start of the designated race is postponed 15 minutes".
- (ii) When displayed over 2 balls or shapes and a class signal means "The scheduled time of the start of the designated race is postponed 30 minutes".
- (iii) When displayed over one of the numeral pennants 1 to 9 over a class signal means "The scheduled time of the start of the designated race is postponed 1 hour, 2 hours etc".
- (iv) When displayed over the letter "A" over a class signal means "The designated race is postponed to a later date".
- (v) When any of the above signals is displayed without a class signal below it means "The whole sailing programme is postponed in accordance with the signal made".

All the above signals will be accompanied by the firing of two guns.

The future date and time for the postponed races will be given by notice on the club sailing notice board not less than 24 hours prior to the date and time decided by the Sailing Committee.

3 TIME LIMIT

There will be no time limit, but for local races the OOD will not normally be required to be in attendance after 22.00 hours. Owners finishing after this time must submit a declaration form to the finishing club.

4 SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Unless the owner is quite satisfied that all rules and Special Regulations have been complied with, he should not return an unqualified declaration at the finish of the race.

5 DECLARATION

The declaration form (when required) must be completed and signed by the person in charge of the yacht and handed to the OOD at the finishing club or sent by post to the Secretary of the finishing Club: G Jones for PSC, or JR Metcalfe, South Caernarvonshire Yacht Club, Abersoch. For ISORA races, forms must be lodged with the race committee as soon as practicable after a yacht has finished.

The declaration form will only be required for the following races:

- Gwlyan Cup Race
- Abersoch - Newquay Race
- James C Eadie Cup Race
- St George's Channel Race
- Any race finishing after 22.00 hours
- Any race requiring a qualified declaration

and should be as follows:

"I declare that I have conformed throughout the race with IYRU and RYA Rules and fully complied with all relevant special and safety regulations.

Statement with non-compliance with any of the above.

6 PROTESTS

Protest arising out of the race must be made in writing and accompanied by the protest fee of £1 to the Officer of the Day at the sponsoring club as soon as is practical after the finishing of the race, or if this is impossible to the Secretary of the sponsoring club by post.

7 YACHTS RETIRING

Yachts failing to complete the course should inform the Officer of the Day at the finishing club either personally, by telephone, or telegram, as soon as possible PSC telephone number - Pwllheli 2219 or SCYC telephone number - Abersoch 2338 *Immediate notification in these circumstances is always of extreme importance.*

8 RYA RULE 1

The Sailing Committee of the sponsoring Club shall have all the powers and duties of the Race Committee as required by the RYA Rule 1. All powers and duties of the Race Committee except those relating to the hearing and decisions of protests, are delegated to the respective officers of the day and starters.

9 RESPONSIBILITY

All those taking part in these races do so at their own risk and responsibility. The RORC, ISORA, PSC and SCYC are not responsible for the sea-worthiness of any yacht whose entry is accepted.

The Sailing Committee of the PSC or SCYC may, at their discretion, refuse or revoke the entry of any yacht without disclosing their reasons for so doing.

10 OFFICER OF THE DAY

Please note the races should be run in accordance with these instructions, not the PSC Hand Book or the SCYC Blue Book which may vary, mainly in relation to signalling of postponements, recalls, courses etc.

11 FINISHING TIMES

Please make careful note that at all times the owner must observe his own finishing time and accurately record this, even in those races for which no declaration form is required.

12 ALTERATIONS AND AMENDMENTS

Any amendment to the particulars contained in this booklet will be posted on the Notice Boards of the Pwllheli Sailing Club and South Caernarvonshire Yacht Club.

RACE INSTRUCTIONS FOR IOR RATED A & B GROUP

1 ELIGIBILITY OF YACHTS

Group 'A' Yachts with an IOR rating of over 21.7' complying with ORC Regulations, Category III. Applicable for the current year.

Group 'B' Yachts with an IOR rating of 21.7' and under and having a minimum waterline of 18.0 ft. Complying with ORC Regulations Category III. Applicable for the current year.

2 RATING CERTIFICATES

All entrants must hold valid IOR Mark III rating certificates.

3 SAFETY REGULATIONS

All yachts must comply with ORC Category III Safety Regulations applicable for the current year. These regulations will be rigidly enforced and yachts will be liable to inspection at any time during the season. Yachts failing to conform may be refused entry or liable to disqualification. In addition, it should be remembered that boats competing in Off Shore Races must carry no more crew than the certified number specified for the liferaft for races beyond Bardsey and/or the Causeway Buoy. For races inside Bardsey and out as far as the Causeway Buoy, a dispensation allowing a 50% increase in the crew over the certified number specified for the liferaft will be allowed.

4 RACING RULES

The races will be started and sailed under IYRU rules subject to RYA rules and ISORA regulations will apply. Between the hours of sunset and sunrise (as defined in Reeds Almanac) navigation lights must be put on and luffing will be prohibited. Any contravention of IYRU rules, International Regulations whilst in force, or ISORA rules must be reported on the declaration.

NB: Owners should pay particular attention to ensure that navigation lights appear at all times as specified above. The practice of contravening these regulations for tactical purposes will render the yacht liable to disqualification.
